### Y2Q Update

At the last MS2 class meeting, Dr. Sara Kim shared with many of you that the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) annually administers the Y2Q (Year-2-Questionnaire) to all second-year medical students across the country. UWSOM relies on the Y2Q data to help guide the school's continuous quality improvement initiatives. When the formal report is shared with the school, Dr. Kim's office prepares a high-level report that can be found here.

As of today, UWSOM's response rate is **18.7%** compared to the national average of **23.4%** (Please see the graph below). Thank you to all of you who have already completed the survey. Three campuses (Spokane, Alaska and Montana) have met or exceeded a 20% response rate!! Please look for the email from AAMC or contact Y2Q@aamc.org to directly obtain the survey link.

# Privacy, Confidentiality, and Information Security Agreement Compliance Deadline: Sun., Nov. 15, 2121

UW Medicine requires all medical students to learn how to properly safeguard confidential information and comply with standards for personal accountability for data stewardship.

Please complete the UW Privacy, Confidentiality, and Information Security Agreement requirement in the To-Do List of your Castlebranch account.

This is an annual SOM and UW Medicine compliance requirement. All students, including concurrent degree/MSTP students and students on a leave of absence, are required to maintain compliance.

Castlebranch will prompt you to do the following in order to meet the UW Medicine Data Stewardship requirements:

- 1. View the Personal Accountability slides (linked in your To-Do List and also attached here). There are 18 slides plus some resources pages. The main points are:
  - a. ENCRYPT your devices, never leave PHI in your car
  - b. Watch out for phishing
  - c. Don't talk about patients on social media, even if you don't mention names

- d. If an unencrypted device that is storing PHI is lost or stolen it is bad, very bad (UW subject to investigations, fines, lawsuits, sanctions etc.)
- 2. Once done viewing the slides, download and complete the PCISA form *downloaded from your CastleBranch Compliance Tracker*.
  - a. Fill in these fields as such:

\*\*\*When you complete the Fillable PCISA 2021 Form, <u>please hit "Export-Save As PDF File" with your Last name, First name, PCISA 2021. The form will not save as completed, unless you hit "export- save as".</u>

- b. Upload the signed form to your UW71 CastleBranch Compliance Tracker by Nov. 15. Make sure your UW Student ID Number is on the form. Please monitor your submission to make sure it is approved.
  - 3.
